Under Scots Law, arms are personal. There is no such thing as a "family" or "clan" Coat of Arms, although all Nesbitt/Nisbet arms share the common feature of three boars on the shield. While it is incorrect to display someone else's arms, as your own, members of the clan are free to wear their Chief's Crest encircled with a strap and buckle bearing the Chief's Motto, or Slogan. The Chief of the Nisbet Clan encourages all, that wish to do so, to adopt the clan badge, in support of the clan. Clan members may also display the arms of the Chief. They must be displayed as those of the Chief and not as of the clan or an individual.
